
That's why we are very proud to have you among all those international colleagues.

Alexander Dubovsky was born in 1962 and member of the Union of Journalists of Ukraine. Member of the Union of Cartoonists of Ukraine.

The current status is a free artist, formerly the organizer and the head of the cartoon club in Dnipro "Hopak", the author of ideas and the editor-in-chief of the publications "Park Humor", "Khalepa", "Piston", etc.

Laureate of more than 100 international competitions of caricatures, including:

Grand Prix at the Humor Festival in Odessa, Silver medal in Japan, Grand Prix in Switzerland, Prize of Honor in Sintra on World Press Cartoon in Portugal.









My private collection has accumulated a large number of catalogues of international cartoon competitions and albums of up to fifty years. These rare books may be of interest to lovers of the art of cartoons. I decided to donate nearly 1200 catalogues and albums from dozens of countries.

The Yaroslav Mudryi National Library of Ukraine, located in Kyiv, will now be a new home for my rare books. These books will be stored in the Department of Rare and Valuable Books and will be available to library visitors.


RONALDO CUNHA DIAS

RONALDO CUNHA DIAS: I always prefer wordless cartoons. I believe that cartooning, as the universal language of humor, should be understood by everyone. And for me, it is extremely pleasurable to know that a cartoon of my authorship being exhibited on the other side of the world has the power to make people of different traditions, customs, and races laugh.

My reference in cartooning is the Argentine QUINO. His style is unique as well as his humorous vein, without precedent. I have been following his work for some years. In Brazil, I cannot fail to mention my admiration for the magnificent work of Ziraldo, considered the master of all Brazilian cartoonists.

In my opinion, the defence of cultural heritage can be objectified through humorous drawings with the critical eye of the cartoonist on the social injustices that distort our cultural heritage. Not only because of social inequality, a major cause of this distortion of cultural heritage, which, when exacerbated by critical drawing, can and should give the reader a detailed picture of the injustices, causing him, the reader, to form a critical opinion of that moment experienced. Brazil is a democratic country, despite having survived a fascist regime in its recent history. The population yearns for democracy and is celebrating the 80th anniversary of the end of this regime worldwide. I can assure you that Brazilian cartoonists as a whole defend democracy and freedom of expression and take a stance of attack when these institutions are threatened. Today's youth, unlike those of the past, with the advent of social networks, are more participatory and demonstrate their opposition to any authoritarian regime.


"Drawing Literature: A Global Caricature Exhibition at the Cervantes Institute in Cairo"

As part of its celebration of World Book Day, the Cervantes Institute in Cairo (the Spanish cultural centre) inaugurated, on April 22, 2025, a caricature portrait exhibition titled "Drawing Literature: Writers in Caricature."

The exhibition featured works by 17 artists from various countries around the world, including participants from Spain, Arab countries, and Latin America.

Organized by the Cervantes Institute in collaboration with the Fayoum Art Centre and FECO (Egyptian Cartoon), the exhibition showcased a remarkable selection of caricature portraits depicting iconic literary figures, including Cervantes, Ghassan Kanafani, Tawfiq Al-Hakim, Kafka, Edgar Allan Poe, Jules Verne, and others.

The celebration coincided with World Book and Copyright Day, established by UNESCO in 1995 to promote a culture of reading and safeguard authors' rights. This global occasion offered a meaningful opportunity to honor literature as a powerful bridge for cultural exchange.










"Tea and Caricature" .. A Cultural and Artistic Celebration at Misr Public Library

As part of the celebration of International Tea Day, the Misr Public Library in Giza hosted a unique cultural and artistic event titled "Tea and Caricature", on Wednesday, May 21, 2025.

The event begins with the presence of Sushil Kumar Lamsal, Ambassador of Nepal to Egypt, Sisira Senavirathne, Ambassador of Sri Lanka to Egypt, Kyaw Tin Shein Ambassador of Myanmar to Egypt, Director of the Misr Public Libraries Fund Ambassador Reda El-Tayfi, and Cartoonist Fawzy Morsy, as well as a group of caricaturists, journalists, media professionals, and the general public.

In this context, artist Fawzy Morsy, who conceived the idea of the celebration, stated that the event is the first of its kind to celebrate tea culture through the art of caricature.

He emphasized that tea is not just a beverage, but a daily ritual that carries messages of friendship and love, and a universal language that unites people.

Morsy added that the celebration highlights the ancient Nepalese tea culture, where a cup of tea becomes a bridge of communication between people, whether in homes or on mountain trails. The celebration program included the opening of a caricature exhibition featuring 65 artworks by around 60 artists representing 25 Arab and foreign countries. Through their works, the artists presented humorous and delightful artistic perspectives on tea culture, offering attendees the chance to enjoy rich visual art flavoured with the traditions and tastes of different peoples.









STRAND-GUT & Das MUSEUM OF MODERN RAT Was lange währt, wird meistens gut! Zwei Künstler, die eine vieljährige Freundschaft verbindet, trafen sich in diesem Sommer in der Spiekerooger "KOGGE". Seit Anfang Juni bis Ende August 2025 dürfen deren beider Kunstwerke noch für die Gäste der wunderschönen Ostfrieseninsel an den Wänden thronen, wie sie vergnügter kaum sein könnte. Was die beiden eint, ist deren Humor und die Gabe, Menschen mit ihren Werken zu erfreuen, indem sie Augenblicke des Daseins einfangen und überspitzt wiedergeben.

Vielleicht hilft in Krisenzeiten ein befreiendes Lachen, ein fröhlicher Text und freundliche Menschen, die sich diese Kunstwerke anschauen, auch wenn man damit die Welt nicht unbedingt ändern kann, das dachten sich Uschi Heusel und Peter Ruge, als sie diese Ausstellung ihrer komischen Kunst planten.

Ruge ist seit Jahrzehnten schon Gast auf der grünen Insel. Seine Stoffbilder sind in der KOGGE schon heimisch mit seinen aufwändig genähten und zum Brüllen komischen Karikaturen vom Leben am Strand. Damit hat Ruge ein absolutes Alleinstellungsmerkmal, welches es vorher nicht auf diese Weise gab.





Ruges "Strand-Gut" nimmt manchmal schrill, derb und immer augenzwinkernd Urlaubssituationen auf die Schippe. Wenn man mag, kann man in den überzeichneten Stoffbildern Spiekerooger Szenen wiederfinden. Die Freiheit des Betrachters ist für einen Cartoonisten unantastbar.

Uschi Heusel darf in diesem Sommer das erste Mal ihre Werke auf Spiekeroog ausstellen. Nach unzähligen Ausstellungen in ihrer Heimat Hessen, Hameln, Frankreich, Italien und sogar bis China, ist sie dieses Mal bis an die Nordseeküste vorgedrungen. Hier ist es den Betrachtern auch gegönnt, ihre ironischen Textmarken unter den Werken zu lesen und erfassen.

Mit "MUSEUM OF MODERN RAT" betitelt Heusel aus Dietzenbach/Hessen ihre seit 2003 bestehende und immer weiter ergänzte Galerie der als Ratten dargestellten und museumsgleich aufwändig eingerahmten Karikaturen. Zusammen mit kurzen Texten rückt sie die Darstellungen in kuriose Momentaufnahmen, die die Betrachter oft an sehr menschliche Situationen erinnern der Gegenwart erinnern und gleichwohl in eine Welt der Alten Meister holen.


The exhibition showcased a diverse collection of cartoon artworks highlighting environmental issues such as nature conservation and sustainability.















JORDAN POP-ILIEV 1940 - 2025





Once again sad news. My dear friend and colleague Jordan died recently.

I met him for the first time in 1984 in Macedonia together with Ane Vasilevski, Dimtr Cudo and Vlado Jocic during the Skopje cartoon contest. They all left our planet!

Sweet memories during a visit Jordan home with his lovely wife Violetta who gave me a record with beautiful Macedonian music (now called North-Macedonia) In all those years Jordan participated in all 19 Dutch Cartoon Contests during the years 1985-2016. Prize-winner in more than 100 cartoon contests world wide.

The last time I saw and spoke Jordan at the festival in Busteni (organized by Cristian Topan) 9 1/2 years ago, but we keep contract.

Jordan graduated from the Faculty of Philosophy with a degree in art history.

He was interested in caricature from his early childhood.

He was a regular contributor to magazines as Borba, Expres-Politika and Jez — Belgrade, Oslobodjenje Sarajevo and may others.

He also worked for the satirical magazine "Osten" and the daily newspaper "Diary", Skopje. His whole life he worked and lived in Skopje. His personal style was respected and known worldwide.

Jordan Pop-Iliev was one of the founders of the Cartoonists' Association of the Republic of Macedonia and was its first secretary since 1981, the initiator and organizer of the first Macedonian exhibition abroad in Legnica, Poland in 1980.



He held solo exhibitions in Amsterdam 1984, Trento 1989, Skopje and some other cities in Berlin, Istanbul, Mexico, Warsaw, Montreal, Rio de Janeiro and others.

In 1990, at the invitation of the Andromeda Festival in Trento (Italy), he held a solo exhibition and released the Apartheid compilation.

His works were presented in many caricature museums in the world, such as Tolentino, Trento, Tehran, Gabrovo, Berlin, Istanbul, Mexico, Warsaw, Montreal, Rio de Janeiro and others.

Remembering a sweet and lovely colleague. Thank you for being in our world. Of course too short my dear friend.





The New Yorker Magazine Turns 100

This year marked the 100th anniversary of the launching of The New Yorker magazine on February 21,1925. It was founded by Harold Ross and his wife Jane Grant. He remained editor until his death in 1951. This magazine is famous worldwide for its serious commentary, fiction, criticism, essays, poetry, journalism (especially after the magazine devoted the entire issue to an article on Hiroshima after the II World War ended), satire and cartoons. It has been managed by just five editors. Besides Mr. Ross, the others were William Shawn, writer Robert Gottlieb, the British Tina Brown (who, coming from Vanity Fair rejuvenated the magazine and made it more visible and trendy) and David Remnick, its current one, who has given it a more political and inclusiveness tone.

The New Yorker has had also only five cartoon editors throughout these 100 years of existence: Rea Irving, who played an important role in developing the art and cartoon content of the magazine in its earlier years, designed the famous dandy mascot "Eustace Tilley", the logo, headers and typeface of the magazine (1925-1939); art editor James Geraghty (1939-1973); cartoonist Lee Lorenz (1973-1993); cartoonist Bob Mankoff (1993-2017) and since then, the young female writer Emma Allen.

It is one of the few magazines in the world that continues to publish cartoons on a regular basis since its inception, a very important component of the publication. It has been the most coveted market for thousands of cartoonists in the US and all over the world and the same can be said for illustrators, writers, poets, and in the last thirty years, photographers as well. Some European artists who have contributed to the magazine are the French JJ Sempé, Rumanian André Francois, Italian Lorenzo Mattotti, Spanish Ana Juan and Mariscal, Dutch Joost Swarte, British Ronald Searle, and Turkish Gürbüz Dogan among others. The offices have been housed at also five different addresses, its longest at 25 West 45th Street and the current is at the Freedom Tower on One World Trade Center since 2015.

As a young aspiring cartoonist, after moving to NYC from my native Mexico, I began to submit my toons in 1983 (during the Lee Lorenz years, very tough to break in during his tenure) and got my first cartoon published until the next century, in October of 2002, under Bob Mankoff, who gave a chance to upcoming cartoonists, many of them young and female.



Other colleagues have had different grades of luck, some selling a cartoon at their first meeting, some took months, and several taking twenty years or more to break in. Many never hit the jackpot. Some have sold just one while some have sold several hundreds. There is no formula as to what they want, it is up to the editors, to what they consider New Yorker's worthy material.


In 2004, Mankoff edited "The Complete Cartoons of The New Yorker", a 656 page huge book that included about two thousand cartoons and a double CD with all the 68,647 cartoons ever published in the magazine since 1925. Another very popular feature initiated by Mankoff in April 2005 is the Cartoon Caption Contest (probably based on a feature the now defunct British magazine Punch used to have, but using old vignettes.) A cartoon is shown without a caption and the readers are invited to submit their own. Three are selected and later a finalist is chosen. The page contains the 3 options, the current competition, the 3 finalists and the winning caption. Thousands of ideas are submitted weekly and to date, Larry Wood, a Chicago lawyer, has won eight times and has been a finalist seven times. He even wrote a book about how to win such competition. Most cartoonists like to have their drawings featured there although at first some were reluctant to participate and some never did.

















First ever cartoon published in the New Yorker











Cartoonist Sam Gross used to say "They should do the same with some articles, leave a blank space at the end so the readers can fill them with their own text, guessing the ending!"

Ms. Allen, who has been the new cartoon editor since May 2017, has had a more open approach and with lots of inclusiveness, and has been more willing to give younger people the opportunity to share their humor, some with great success. 172 new cartoonists have published in the magazine since then. Younger generations have a new way to see the world and that is very important, the evolution and new approach to life or ways of seeing it and what makes us laugh or ponder. New voices are vital to a publication.

Ms. Allen has also given a chance to humorous writers and also to collaborations between a writer and a cartoonist, something that used to be the norm for many years in the magazine, when the editors used to purchase gags or ideas from cartoonists so other more established names illustrated them. Unfortunately, many of those unnamed cartoonists only saw a paycheck but never the honor to see their names credited. Fortunately for some, they ended up getting their own work published. Among those who used other cartoonists' ideas were the iconic cartoonists Chas Addams, George Price, James Thurber and Peter Arno.

One particular cartoon artist who changed the way humorous drawings were seen, was the Rumanian architect Saul Steinberg, whom the magazine brought to the US in 1942 after fleeing Italy to the Dominican Republic a year earlier, before he suffered the misfortune of millions of his fellow Jewish people in Europe. His style was a fresh breath to a stalled type of cartoon. He is considered the Picasso of cartooning and imitated by many and the inspiration for countless, to this day. He elevated the sophistication in cartoon art. He considered himself as «a writer who draws.» Because of his ventures into diverse territories (cartoons, illustration, textiles, photo works, stage design, fine arts, museums and galleries exhibitions, murals, etc.) he is not only considered a cartoonist but a multifaceted artist. He published in his lifetime 85 covers and 642 drawings, although the magazine has continued to publish his work. His most famous artwork —imitated and parodied all over the world—is the March 29, 1976 cover «View of the World from 9th Avenue", based on a cartoon by John McCutcheon from the Chicago Tribune from July 27,1922.

Other cartoonists who have had major influences in generations of cartoonists, beside those previously

mentioned, include George Booth, Gahan Wilson, Ed Koren, Sam Gross and Roz Chast. A new crop of cartoonists include Liana Fink, Emily Flake, Paul Noth and Jeremy Nguyen among hundreds of new contributors. The bar has been raised considerably, taking into consideration that every week, the cartoon editor reviews around 2500 cartoons when only an average of 12 to 15 get purchased.

The covers have been art directed by French designer Francoise Mouly since 1993. She is married to artist Art Spigelman of "Maus" book fame, and who contributed acerbic covers until he stopped doing them years later for personal reasons. The covers tend to have at times more political overtones, and some have been controversial. The Canadian artist Barry Blitt has played a good role showing the true colors and clothes of the new emperor ruling the United States again. The same can be said of another feature called The Daily Cartoon, featured only online, five times a week, interspersing regular humor with politics.

The festivities for the 100 anniversary included 3 exhibitions: one at The New York Public Library showcasing rare manuscripts, photographs, cartoons, covers, letters and memorabilia plus a comprehensive video; an exhibition at the Society of Illustrators showing 100 original cartoons along the magazine's history (I had the honor to have one there) and another show at the Alliance Française showing a selection of covers, sketches, rejections and notes from the art editor. Plus two parties, one for cartoonists and another for regular contributors. As a colleague and friend of many cartoonists from the New Yorker during the past 40 plus years, I have had the privilege of having lunch with many of them, celebrating our profession, complaining about dwindling markets and editors, visiting museums, conferences, movies, exhibitions, attending parties and sadly, several funerals as well. It has been great camaraderie all this time and I have learned very much from this interaction and forged nice friendships. And it has been an honor to have my cartoons published in The New Yorker. Cheers for the next 100 years!


















THE FIRST FECO CHINA CONFERENCE
